COLLEGE AT A GLANCE

1st Foundation Day Celebration of Wangkhao Government College on 5th July 1984.

The present Wangkhao Government College Mon, initially a private college known and inaugurated as Mon Arts College, had its first Inaugural Function on 5th July 1983 at Mon Government High School premises with the Principal of the College, Mr. N V George serving notice to the students to attend the Inaugural meeting. The State Education Minister Mr. Nocklem was the Chief Guest of the Programme.

The setting up of Arts College Mon, now called Wangkhao Government College, was the fulfilment of a long-felt desire of the people of Mon district as a whole and the entire Konyak community in particular. The establishment of this college was spearheaded by the then Konyak Students' Conference (KSC), now the Konyak Students' Union (KSU), through a resolution adopted in their annual conference in the late nineteen seventies.

Currently, the college offers Degree Course in Arts with Major in English, Education, History, Sociology, Political Science and Economics.

The college is NAAC assessed with a grade of B+ and CGPA of 2.55.

The distance between Deputy Commissioner's Office, Mon and Wangkhao Government College is 4.5 km.

The distance between Deputy Commissioner's Office, Mon and Bhojo (BOJ) Railway Station near Sonari is 60 km.

COURSES OFFERED

The college offers Major courses in Six Disciplines namely Economics, Education, English, History, Political Science and Sociology. To be eligible for admission an applicant must have passed in the Senior Secondary School Leaving or Higher Secondary (12th Grade) Certificate obtained after successful completion of Grade 12 or equivalent stage of education corresponding to Level-4. However, considering the limited seat availability, admission shall be granted purely on merit basis through Entrance Test. The number of seats as approved by appropriate statutory authority (NU) is 50 in each of the six Major programmes of study for the academic session 2024-2025.

PROGRAMMES OF STUDY

As per Nagaland University (NU) guidelines on New Education Policy 2020, the following courses are offered from the Academic Session 2024-2025:

MAJOR AND MINOR DISCIPLINES

Major discipline is the discipline or subject of main focus and the degree will be awarded in that discipline. Students should secure the



prescribed number of credits (about 50% of total credits) through core courses in the major discipline.

Minor discipline helps a student to gain a broader understanding beyond the major discipline. For example, if a student pursuing an Economics major obtains a minimum of 12 credits from a bunch of courses in Statistics, then the student will be awarded B.A. degree in Economics with a Minor in Statistics

Note: 50% of the total credits from minors may be secured in the relevant subject/discipline and another 50% of the total credits can be earned from any discipline as per students' choice.

Students are advised to choose Minor discipline from other relevant subjects in such a way that the knowledge gained from the Minor papers enriches the study of the Core Major course of the student

Note: A core course offered in a Major discipline/subject may be treated as a Minor core course by other discipline/subject and vice versa.

AWARDING UG CERTIFICATE, UG DIPLOMA, AND DEGREES

UG CERTIFICATE

Students who opt to exit after completion of the first year and have secured 40 credits will be awarded a UG certificate if, in addition, they complete one vocational course of 4 credits during the summer vacation of the first year. These students are allowed to re-enter the degree programme within three years and complete the degree programme within the stipulated maximum period of seven years.

UG DIPLOMA

Students who opt to exit after completion of the second year and have secured 80 credits will be awarded the UG diploma if, in addition, they complete one vocational course of 4 credits during the summer vacation of the second year. These students are allowed to



re-enter within a period of three years and complete the degree programme within the maximum period of seven years

3-YEAR UG DEGREE

Students who wish to undergo a 3-year UG programme will be awarded UG Degree in the Major discipline after successful completion of three years, securing 120 credits and satisfying the minimum credit requirement as given in Table 1.

4-YEAR UG DEGREE (HONOURS)

A four-year UG Honours degree in the major discipline will be awarded to those who complete a four year degree programme with 160 credits and have satisfied the credit requirements as given in Table 1.

4-YEAR UG DEGREE (HONOURS WITH RESEARCH)

Students who secure 75% marks and above in the first six semesters and wish to undertake research at the undergraduate level can choose a research stream in the fourth year. They should do a research project or dissertation under the guidance of a faculty member of the College. The research project/dissertation will be in the major discipline. The students, who secure 160 credits, including 12 credits from a research project/dissertation, are awarded UG Degree (Honours with Research).

Note: Honours students not undertaking research project will do 3 theory courses for 12 credits in lieu of a research project / Dissertation.

UG DEGREE PROGRAMMES WITH SINGLE MAJOR

A student has to secure a minimum of 50% credits from the major discipline for the 3-year/4-year UG degree to be awarded a single major. For example, in a 3-year UG programme, if the total number of credits to be earned is 120, a student of Physics with a minimum of 60 credits will be awarded a B.Sc. in Physics with a single major. Similarly, in a 4-year UG programme, if the total



number of credits to be earned is 160, a student of Physics with a minimum of 80 credits will be awarded a B.Sc. (Hons./Hon. With Research) in Physics in a 4-year UG programme with single major.

UG DEGREE PROGRAMMES WITH DOUBLE MAJOR

A student has to secure a minimum of 40% credits from the second major discipline for the 3-year/4- year UG degree to be awarded a double major. For example, in a 3-year UG programme, if the total number of credits to be earned is 120, a student of Physics with a minimum of 48 credits will be awarded a B.Sc. in Physics with a double major. Similarly, in a 4-year UG programme, if the total number of credits to be earned is 160, a student of Physics with a minimum of 64 credits will be awarded a B.Sc. (Hons./Hon. With Research) in Physics in a 4-year UG programme with double major.

STRUCTURE OF THE UNDERGRADUATE PROGRAMME

The UG programme will consist of the following categories of courses and the minimum credit requirements for 3-year UG and 4-year UG (Honours) or UG (Honours with Research) programmes are given below:

STUDENTS' UNION & ACTIVITIES.

- a) Each student of the college is a member of the Wangkhao Government College Students' Union (WGCSU). The executives of the WGCSU are directly elected by all the students through secret ballot. Besides, they function as the official representatives of the students for all students-related activities.
- b) The Principal is the ex-officio President of the WGCSU.
- c) A student Advisor/ Advisory Committee is nominated by the Principal from amongst the teachers to guide and advise the student and to deal with the issues that may arise from the students. They will generally attend the Council meeting as and when these are conducted.
- d) The General Council shall consist of the executive council members and class Representatives of respective Classes.
- e) The Executive Council comprises the following:
 - a. President
 - b. General Secretary
 - c. Asst. General Secretary
 - d. Games and Sports Secretary
 - e. Asst. Games and Sports Secretary
 - f. Literary and Magazine Secretary
 - g. Asst. Literary and Magazine Secretary
 - h. Cultural Secretary
 - i. Asst. Cultural Secretary
 - j. Two (2) Class Representatives from every class/semester.

LEAVE POLICY AND PROCEDURES

The Following shall constitute leave policy and procedure for strict Compliance:

1. Leave cannot be claimed as a matter of right.
2. No socially related leave such as attending a marriage party, church related activities, political party meeting shall be entertained.
3. Leave shall be permitted on the following grounds with condition thereof:



- i. Games and Sports: If a student is participating in/representing district/state level tournament his/her leave may be granted for class attendance only provided he/she submits the recommendation from the competent authority for that specific period. Nevertheless, the students will have to fulfill all necessary requirements with regard to internal assessment system.
- ii. NCC/NSS/RRC/YRC: If a student is undergoing training /camping his/her leave should be routed through teacher-in-charge for consideration of attendance only. For internal assessment the rule provided under 3(i) applies.
- iii. Medical Leave: In case of sickness an advance leave application should reach the college authority and while on return to college, a medical certificate from competent medical practitioner along with a copy of the doctor's prescription shall be produced. For internal assessment, the rule provided under 3(i) applies.
- iv. Apart from the aforementioned leave, no other leave shall be entertained.

GUIDELINES ON COURSE OF STUDY, SEMESTER SYSTEM & EXAMINATIONS

1. Degree course must be completed within a period of minimum 5 years.
2. The duration of odd semester I, III & V shall start from May to Oct (06 months).
3. The duration of even semester II, IV & VI shall start from Nov to April (06 months).
(Guidelines 1-3 are subject to Nagaland University Notification)
4. Under the Nagaland University notification 2012, each semester will be followed by End Semester Examination which is conducted by the university.

CONDUCT OF EXAMINATIONS

All End Semester Examination question papers are prepared by the Nagaland University.



A. EXAMINATION ROUTINE

All examination routines will be duly notified by the university on their website.

B. STUDENTS ASSESSMENT AND PROGRESSION

The performance of a student shall be evaluated on a 25:75 basis i.e. 25 marks for Internal Assessment and 75 marks for End Semester Examination through all Major Courses.

C. PASS MARKS

In order to qualify for End Semester Examination, a student must secure a minimum of 40% of marks in the internal assessment i.e. 10 marks and 40% of marks in the end semester examination i.e. 30 marks respectively.

D. Activities for Internal Assessment

The Internal Assessment for 25 marks shall be conducted through any three of the following: 1.Class test, 2.Assignments, 3.Seminar, 4.Quiz, 5.Group discussions, 4.Project work, 5.Presentation and any other relevant activities.

RULES & REGULATIONS

1. 80% attendance in each paper is mandatory for all students to fill end term examination forms.
2. Irregular attendance, indifference in regard to class work and examination, discourtesy towards teachers, insubordination, obscenity in words and behaviour, willful damages to college property, anti-social activities etc. are liable for disciplinary action which includes expulsion from the college.
3. Attendance will be taken at the beginning of each class; late comers shall enter class room with permission of the teacher.
4. Impersonation at roll call will be considered serious offence.
5. It is the responsibility of parents and guardians to find out from the department concerned the attendance score of their ward(s) from time to time
6. Every student shall handle college property with care and shall do everything in power to preserve cleanliness and tidiness of the furniture, building and the premises. Students shall not



disfigure the walls, doors, windows, furniture etc. with spit, bills engravings etc. Furthermore, the cost of any damage, if caused to college property will be charged from the account of the students responsible for the damage in addition to disciplinary action.

7. Students are expected to take active part in extra and co-curricular activities like Games & Sports, Literary, Cultural, National Service Scheme, Red Ribbon Club, Evangelical Union, Eco Club, Nasha Mukt Abhiyan, Fitness Club, Ek Bharat Shreshtha Bharat etc. and any other activities undertaken by the college.
8. Students are required to wear uniforms on all days.
9. Students must exhibit discipline in dress, language and behaviour.
10. Students are expected to support the College in keeping the College-Tobacco-Free Zone, Eco-Friendly and Plastic Free Campus.
11. Rioting/agitation against another group of students or any reason whatsoever is prohibited.
12. Ragging/teasing/intimidating/harassing/using words of abuse etc. on junior students and opposite sex are punishable under the law.
13. Use of mobile phones in the class is strictly prohibited.
14. In all matters not specified in the forgoing rule, students shall aim at conducting themselves respecting the right of others so as to establish and maintain good tradition and reputation of the institution.
15. Any further rule and regulation framed by the College from time to time shall be binding to all.

FACILITIES

1. Clean and safe drinking water facility is available in the college building.
2. College buses ply daily between the town and the college campus on all working days.



3. The college has a library with reading room/computer facility for students, staff as well as faculty. Students are to make use of the library facilities for their academic benefits.
4. First aid is available in the Academic Building. Medical Inspection (MI) room is available.
5. Games and sports facilities such as football, badminton court, basketball court, table tennis board, volleyball, and carom are available for the students in the college.
6. Canteen/cafeteria is available in the college.
7. College has an auditorium for various activities of the college.
8. Common room facilities for male/female students are available.
9. Diploma Courses are available in IGNOU Centre at Wangkhao Government College.
10. Two class representatives shall be elected from each class. Only those students having minimum attendance percentage of 80% shall be qualified for contesting in the CR election. The responsibilities of the CRs are to assist the teachers in maintaining discipline in the class, and also initiate among the mates in keeping the classrooms clean and tidy, stain-free etc.

LIBRARY RULES

1. Library card is mandatory for access to the library.
2. A member shall be allowed to borrow 2 books per card for a week.
3. Late fine will be collected if the book is not returned after the due date.
4. Librarian may ask to return any book from any member at any time and the member shall return the book soon.
5. If books are lost, the borrower shall replace the books of the same edition or latest edition or pay double price of the book after getting permission from the librarian.
6. If the card is lost, it should be reported to the librarian and duplicate card will be issued against formal application and fine.
7. The card is valid till the end of the course and must be duly surrendered.



8. No Due Certificate should be obtained by each student after returning the books issued, surrendering the borrower's card and clearing outstanding dues if any
